CALL TO ORDER

CHAIR'S COMMENTS

Audit & Finance Committee Chair, Jeff Lord, was absent from the meeting. Vice Chair, C. Gelbsman,

MEETING MINUTES

C. Gelbsman requested a motion to approve the meeting minutes from the April 14th Audit & Finance Committee meeting. Members were given the draft minutes prior to the meeting for review. There being no corrections, D. Rowley made a motion to approve the meeting minutes. C. Robinson seconded the motion, and it was approved by remaining members.

PAYMENT OF BILLS

M. Marino reviewed the bills and deposits made since the April Audit & Finance Committee meeting. Committee members received a report of the expenses and deposits prior to the meeting to review. Because there wasn't an April Board Meeting, M. Marino noted that she did pay some bills prior to this meeting. She noted that there were no expenses out of the ordinary. She pointed out the payments to

Mostert, Manzanero & Scott, LLP. for their work on the 2021 IDA and CRC financial audits. She also pointed out the work being done by the MRB Group on the USDA Rise grant application and Barton & Loguidice for their work on the EDA grant administration for the Richfield Springs project.

D. Rowley made a motion to approve paying the expenses presented to the committee. J. Seward seconded the motion, and it was approved by remaining members.

REVIEW OF FINANCIALS

J. Zakrevsky reviewed the CFO's reports for April, which included the profit & loss statement, the balance sheet, and the loan portfolio. He also reviewed his YTD budget with the group. C. Robinson asked if there were any concerns with the trending negative income thus far this year. J. Zakrevsky advised that he is not concerned, as that is usually how it trends in the first six months of the year. He noted that M. Marino is working on the grant reimbursement for the Rail Yards study, which we should be reimbursed for this year. We also need to voucher the County for this years appropriation.

NEW AND UNFINISHED BUSINESS

• Enviro Energy – M. Marino advised that she received a call from Gary Grayson, an attorney out of Walton, NY who is representing Bob and May Miller, former owners of Enviro Energy. They are in the midst of negotiating a deal to sell that property and Gary called to get a pay off letter for the outstanding loan that Enviro Energy has with the IDA. Because this loan had previously been moved into reserves, the IDA would waive the interest fees accrued and only ask that Enviro Energy pay off the principal balance on their loan and the cost for the discharge of mortgage, which is \$50.50. The balance requested in the pay-off letter was \$46,003.75.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Rowley made a motion to enter executive session with committee members only, under the Public Officers Law, Article 7, Open Meetings Law Section 105, at 8:13am for the following reasons: To discuss the financial history of an outstanding loan with the agency.
